P.G. Course in Political Science

1. Online application for admission in M.A. Course is mandatory for all potential incumbents.
2. As per letter vide 48/7/Imp-21
Dated 15.09.2021, 80% of the intake in each P.G. Department shall be filled up by the students of the University of North Bengal and the remaining 20% of their seats in Post Graduate Courses will be available for open competition among the graduates from other Universities including University of North Bengal. In both the cases selection will be made strictly on the basis of merit in the qualifying Examination.
3. In both the above categories the reservation policies towards SC/ST/OBC(A)/OBC(B)/PwD shall be followed as per the government norms.
4. As per Govt. notification no. 758-Edn(CS)/10M-95/14 dated 3rd July, 2018 the verification of documents should be done only when the students report at the commencement of classes in due course.
5. Course fee will not be refunded/ adjusted if a candidate discontinues the course.
6. Once a student's name appears in the merit list, and he/she fails to take admission within stipulated time, his/her name would not be considered in any subsequent list of the same category [*i.e.* 80% or 20%] of the same subject.

A. Eligibility:-

The candidates with Honours Degree [10+2+3 system] in the respective subject shall be eligible to apply for admission to M.A. course. Candidates who have passed UG Examination three years earlier or more before the year of admission shall not be eligible for admission to M.A. course (*e.g.*, candidate passing UG Examination in 2018 or before shall not be eligible for admission in P.G.

B. Student Intake:

The student intake in the PG Course in the Department of Political Science of Kalimpong College for the academic session 2021–2022 is **20**.

- Persons with disabilities (PwD) will enjoy a 5% reservation in each of the categories, i.e. in SC, ST, OBC(A), OBC(B) and in the unreserved or General Category, and such candidates, if available, will be given priority.

Selection Procedures

The following procedure will be followed:-

1. Applications in the general category will be arranged in order of merit including the students of SC/ST/OBC(A)/OBC(B) category, if any.
2. For admission an SC or ST candidate should have obtained in the previous examination; qualifying marks not lower by more than 25% of the marks obtained by the last candidate of the general category. In case of OBC(A) and OBC(B) the candidates getting admission should have obtained in the previous examination qualifying marks not lower by more than 10% from the marks obtained by the last candidate of the general category. In case, if a candidate obtains marks lower than the minimum qualifying marks prescribed by the University/Appropriate Authority for admission to the relevant course, he will not be eligible for admission.
3. If the SC Candidates fall short of the reserved quota, the vacancies will be filled up by the ST candidates and vice versa. If the OBC(A) candidates fall short of the reserved quota, the vacancies will be filled up by the OBC(B) candidates and vice versa. If after this exercise, reserved seats still remain unfilled due to non-availability of reserved category candidates, such seats shall be taken up for de-reservation and after getting approval from concerned authority the vacancies will be filled up by the candidates of general category.

Other clause

Students failing to attain 75% of attendance during a particular semester of P.G. course shall not be permitted to seat in the Semester-End examination of P.G. course.
